



**NWU Correct Wear** - The Shirt/Blouse worn outside the waistband of the NWU trousers. Sleeves will be rolled in accordance with Section 2102.11, when directed. NSCC Cadet Flash is attached to the Right Breast Pocket on the NWU - Crow facing Inward (Left). Name Tapes will be NWU type with Last Name above the right breast pocket and the USNSCC Tape attached above the left breast pocket. Navy Blue T-Shirt, Black Socks, and Black Belt with Silver Buckle.

**BDU Correct Wear** - The camouflage utility coat/shirt is to be worn outside the waistband of the camouflage utility trousers. Sleeves will be rolled in accordance with Section 2102.11, when directed. NSCC Olive Drab Shoulder Flashes on Both Shoulders - Crow facing forward. Name Tapes will be Olive Drab type with Last Name above the right breast pocket and the USNSCC Tape attached above the left breast pocket. Brown T-Shirt, Black Socks, and Black Belt with Black Buckle.



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## Hand Salute




**HOW**

- RAISE RIGHT HAND IN A DIRECT MANNER
- TIP OF FOREFINGERS TOUCHES THE LOWER PART OF THE HEADGEAR ABOVE AND TO RIGHT OF THE EYE.
- KEEP THUMB AND FINGERS STRAIGHT AND FIRMLY TOGETHER.
- SHOULD BE ABLE TO SEE THEIR ENTIRE PALM WHEN LOOKING STRAIGHT AHEAD. THE UPPER ARM IS PARALLEL TO THE DECK AND THE FOREARM IS AT A 45 DEGREE ANGLE.
- WHEN NOT IN BARRACKS TURN HEAD AND EYES TOWARD THE PERSON OF COLORS BEING SALUTED.

**WHEN**

- EXECUTE AT ATTENTION OR WHILE MARCHING.
- SALUTE OFFICERS, PARADING COLORS, OR STANDARDS.
- 8-8 PAGES OR AT THE REAREST POINT.
- SALUTE COLORS OR THE MUSIC FOR COLORS WHEN IN SIGHT OR HEARING.
- SALUTE WHEN COVERED AND OUTDOORS.
- INDOORS IF IN THE PERFORMANCE OF WATCH STANDING DUTIES.
- JUNIORS ALWAYS SALUTE FIRST.
- SALUTE SMARTLY.



## Boot and Shoe Shine

The quality of a soldier is often measured by how much time, effort and care he/she expends their boots. Here's how to apply that high-gloss spit shine:

### Here's How:

- Spread a medium-thick layer of paste polish over the portion of the boot to be spit shined.
- Allow it to dry for 5 to 10 Minutes.
- Wrap a soft, clean cloth around your index finger so that it is smooth (no wrinkles). Alternately, you can use a cotton ball. Dip your finger or the cotton ball into a container of water. The cloth/cotton should be wet, but not dripping.
- Buff the dried polish (using a circular motion) with the wet cloth/cotton.
- Still using the damp rag on your finger, apply a fine layer of polish in a circular motion and keep on rubbing lightly until a hazy shine develops.
- Using the (now) damp cloth, or cotton ball, keep applying THIN coats of wax, buffing them with a small circular motion.
- When the boot is highly glossed, use a clean dry soft cloth or a shining brush to give it a final buff.

### Tips:

- The reason to use a wet cloth is to stop the fine coats of polish sticking to the cloth and to encourage the polish to stick to the leather.
- You want to keep on building up thin layers of wax until you have a completely smooth surface that gives the glossy shine.
- After the first heavy coat of polish you must use small amounts of polish to build up the shine. If you use too much polish, it will dissolve the base you have already built up.

**T-shirts work well for the cloth material, as do cloth diapers.**
